


PROJECT DESCRIPTION


SEPTA is proposing new bus Route 49 to serve Brewerytown, Fairmount, and Grays Ferry via University City. Initial analysis, conducted in partnership with University City District (UCD), identified an existing and future unmet demand for improved service between these neighborhoods and University City, a gap that would be addressed by proposed Route 49.

New Development, Population, and Employment Growth in University City



The fast pace of development and job growth in University City has transformed the neighborhood into Philadelphia's second downtown. With 11% of the city's jobs on less than 2% of its land area, University City is home to some of the strongest drivers of job growth in the region. Additionally, with the recent announcement of the uCity Square and Schuylkill Yards development sites, millions of square feet of office and residential space, along with tens of thousands of jobs, will be added to the neighborhood over the coming decades increasing demand for transit service.


University City Population


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Neighborhood Transit



Existing bus routes that travel through Brewerytown, Fairmount and Grays Ferry do not provide direct transit access to University City. This is the major issue that proposed Route 49 aims to address.

Existing Demand



Brewerytown, Fairmount and Grays Ferry are home to a large and disproportionate share of the University City workforce and thus offer great potential ridership demand for this new service. Proposed Route 49 will also provide needed additional capacity between employment nodes in Center City and the neighborhoods to its north.




